KDWP claims feeding spreads Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD)

FACT: States with highest CWD rates have restricted or banned feeding for decades, yet high CWD rates have remained.

FACT: Supplemental feeding improves herd nutrition levels making deer less susceptible to CWD and other diseases.

FACT: Kansas has lower CWD cases than other mid-western states and we have always allowed deer feeding.

Harmful effects will occur if the Commission bans deer feeding:

- The Kansas deer population will shrink.
 - -KDWP admits that feeding results in increased deer populations.
